First round of 2022 Community Grants awarded

We're pleased to announce that 18 community groups will share in almost \$50,000 in grants to deliver community projects and initiatives throughout the shire.

This round of funding will support the creation of a welcome kit for new residents of Campbells Creek, provide support for community members of Maldon who are living with dementia, upgrade the accessibility of the Mount Alexander Vintage Engine Club and provide new equipment to improve safety for the Castlemaine Cycling Club.

"We're proud to support such a diverse array of projects through our Community Grants program," said Sarah Gradie, Social Equity and Inclusion Officer at Mount Alexander Shire Council.

"It's exciting to see so many applications from organisations that focus on inclusivity and community engagement."

The next round of Community Grants opens on 18 July 2022.




New footpaths are a-foot

Changes to cat and dog laws

At the February Council meeting, Councillors voted to implement changes to local cat and dog laws, including a cat curfew and new dogs on-lead rules.

We understand that pet owners will need time to adjust, and would like to assure you that we won't actively be enforcing the changes immediately.




Proposed budget 2022/2023

- 6.30pm, Tuesday 19 April: Ordinary Meeting of Council to consider proposed budget
- 12.00pm, Wednesday 20 April: Proposed budget goes on public exhibition
- 5.00pm, Wednesday 11 May: Closing date for public submissions
- 5.30pm, Wednesday 24 May: Special Meeting of Council to hear budget submissions
- 6.30pm, Tuesday 21 June: Adopt 2022/2023 Budget at an Ordinary Meeting of Council.
