## National Sorry Day and Reconciliation Week 2022

National Sorry Day and Reconciliation Week are being recognised across the shire with a range of events.

National Sorry Day (Thursday 26 May) is an annual day of remembrance which

acknowledges the pain and injustice experienced by members of the stolen generation.

Uncle Rick Nelson, Dja Dja Wurrung Elder, conducted a Smoking Ceremony and Welcome to Country at the Castlemaine Botanical Gardens last week to acknowledge Sorry Day. The ceremony also featured guest speaker Ron Murray, Wamba Wamba, Tatiara man.

National Reconciliation Week, which began on Friday 27 May, is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements, and to stop and think about how we can contribute to, and work towards, reconciliation.

There's been a range of activities for the community to get involved in, including film screenings, a special story time with Aunty Kerri Douglas, a week-long Sorry Tree and Possum Skin Cloak display, exhibition at the Castlemaine Market Building, and much more.
