Take a look at our 2022/2023 proposed budget

Initiatives that reduce the impact of flooding, improvements to increase road safety, and upgrades to community sporting facilities are just a few highlights of our proposed budget for 2022/2023.

Other highlights include:

- Construction of flood levees in Castlemaine and Campbells Creek.
- Continued upgrades and improvements of community sports facilities, including new change facilities at Maldon's Bill Woodfull Recreation Reserve (subject to funding), improved change rooms and toilet facilities at Harcourt Leisure Centre, and a new netball court at Campbells Creek Recreation Reserve.
- Upgrades to a 2.24km stretch of Fogarty's Gap Road, between Woodbrook and Leversha Roads.
- Continuing town streetscapes improvements with the redevelopment of Frederick Street Castlemaine, between Mostyn and Lyttleton Streets, over two financial years.
- Upgrades to Yeats Street in Castlemaine by sealing the residential street.

We're pleased to announce that 13 recipients will share in \$26,000 in grants to deliver community events throughout the shire.

This round of funding supports projects such as the Castlemaine Emergency Response Expo where you can check out the emergency vehicles, meet the first responders and find out what volunteer opportunities are available. Another highlight is the Castlemaine Documentary Festival which will take place in July and will deliver both in-cinema and digital documentaries as well as panel discussions.

We're proud to support Pride Across the Ages, a new podcast that shares generational stories of pride from LGBTIQA+ people who call central Victoria home.

The ten episode podcast is a collection of incredibly moving, funny and raw stories from our community. It tells the life stories of ten Mount Alexander Shire residents as they grow up and come out. It focuses on their feelings on the decriminalisation of homosexuality in Victoria and what pride means to them – how they live it and celebrate it, then and now.

It will be launched at the Castlemaine Library on Thursday 5 May, 5.30pm-7.00pm with a listening party, and a meet and greet with the LGBTIQA+ Steering Group. Monday 8 August 2022, for events held in the first half of 2023.
