- Completing Old Bank Corner, concrete footpaths replacement with asphalt.

We will also progressively replace the old timber pedestrian and vehicle bridges.

As with many elements of this project, our ability to undertake work is weather dependent. Considering this, our team are monitoring the rain radar regularly and adjusting work plans to reflect any predicted inclement weather.

HARCOURT Lions football, netball, cricket, and tennis clubs, along with the Mount Alexander Falcons (Women's Football Club), can look forward to preparing for the big games in a new female-friendly pavilion, thanks to the completion of works at Harcourt Recreation Reserve.

Until recently, the Lions women's and girls' teams had to resort to using an old toilet block at the ground to get changed. Now that the Mount Alexander Falcons Women's Football Club call Harcourt home, it is even more important to have these new change-rooms and toilets.

The new pavilion is a game-changer, providing the first female-friendly player and umpire change rooms and amenities at the ground and comes complete with social spaces suitable for sports and community events.

It is the new headquarters for the 270-strong Lions to grow teams and host more competitions and events, with nearby Harcourt Valley Primary School also able to access the new building.

The pavilion was made possible by over \$370,000 from the Victorian Government's Local Sports Infrastructure Fund and financial contributions from Mount Alexander Shire Council and the local community.

Member for Bendigo West Maree Edwards said, "Regional clubs and communities depend on local facilities. The new pavilion not only helps secure the future of the grassroots sport but provides a boost for local groups as well. "It will go a long way to

inspiring even more locals to join local sporting teams, with the community now having the facilities they need to welcome more women and girls to train longer, and compete," said MP Edwards.

"Better facilities make it easier for Victorians to get back into local sport and recreation and live active and healthy lifestyles."


