

Maldon Streetscape Revitalisation Project

Project update – Friday 8 April 2022



Main Street in Maldon is looking refreshed and renewed following works to resurface the asphalt footpaths.

We have heard from regular footpath users, who are telling us they are pleased that trip hazards have been removed, and the footpaths where works have been complete are smooth, safe and suitable for all ages and abilities to enjoy.

Next week works to resurface the asphalt footpaths will continue from Portia & Co to Berryman's Café and Tearooms. The new asphalt stops at Poppy's of Maldon.

The renewed asphalt footpaths will be cleaned progressively as works are completed to achieve a consistent finish on the footpath.

After Easter, we continue resurfacing the asphalt footpaths on the west side of Main Street in Maldon, on the side of the same side as the butcher.

Renovation works on the historic stone culverts is continuing, and will progress towards retail outlet Polly and Willow.

Works have begun to replace existing Old Bank Corner concrete crossovers with timber along High and Main Streets and repair the stone drains. We are anticipating that this will be complete within the week.

The process of restoring shopfronts in Maldon is continuing, with works progressively implemented by independent contractors on behalf of building owners.

Thank you to the community of Maldon for your support, patience and cooperation while works are progressed on the project.

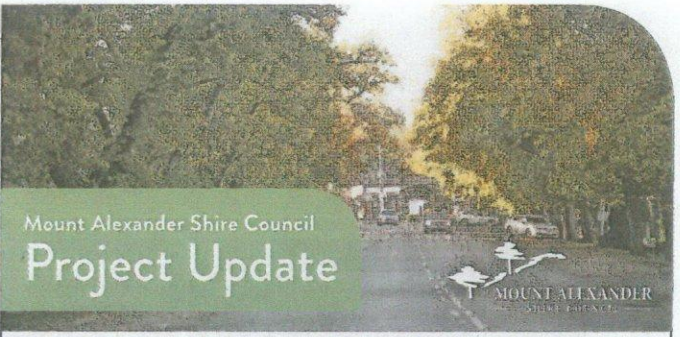

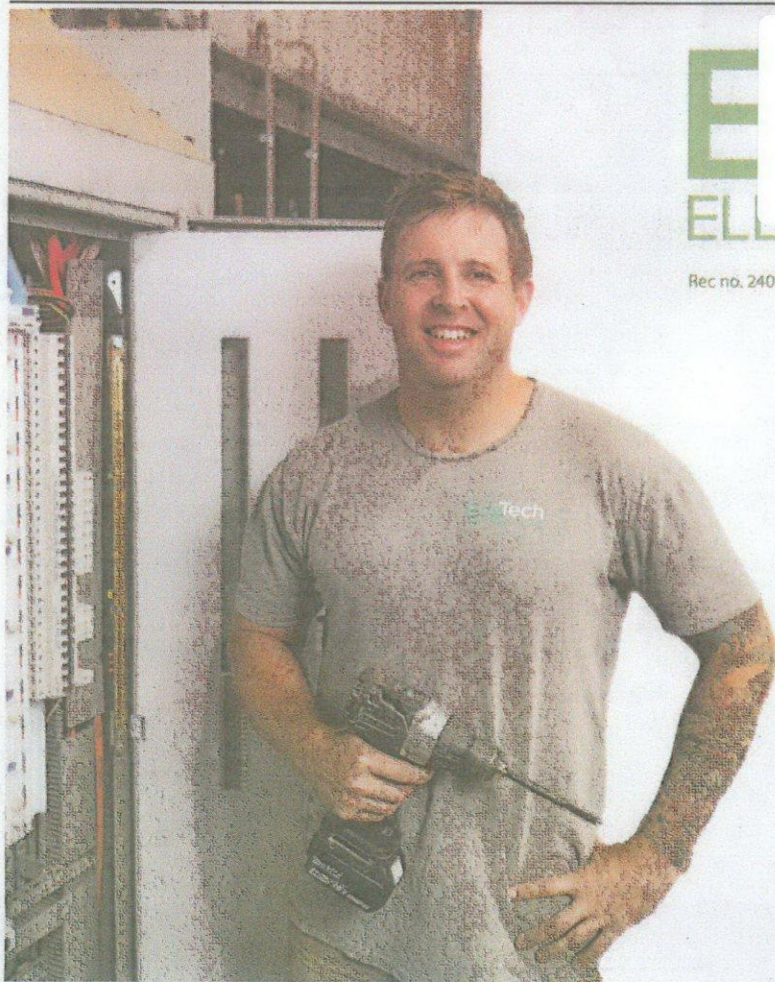

Parking changes in Mostyn Street Castlemaine

Council's Director of Infrastructure and Development, Michael Annear said the temporary parking trial aimed to improve safety in the area.

"The temporary changes we're making to two parking bays in Mostyn Street are in direct response to feedback from shire residents," he said.

"Community members are concerned that visibility for both motorists and pedestrians at this busy pedestrian crossing is poor, and we're taking action on that feedback.

Council will be installing signs next to the two affected parking bays notifying people about the temporary arrangements.

"We are working in consultation with local business owners on the temporary trial,

which will be underway from April until October this year," said Mr Annear.

"Community feedback on the trial is critically important, and we'll be asking for the community and businesses to share their views on the trial via our online engagement platform www.shape.mountalexander.vic.gov.au during the trial."

Other new safety measures being undertaken at the Mostyn Street zebra crossing include the installation of Tactile Ground Indicators (TGI), which are designed to provide directional guidance to vision-impaired people.

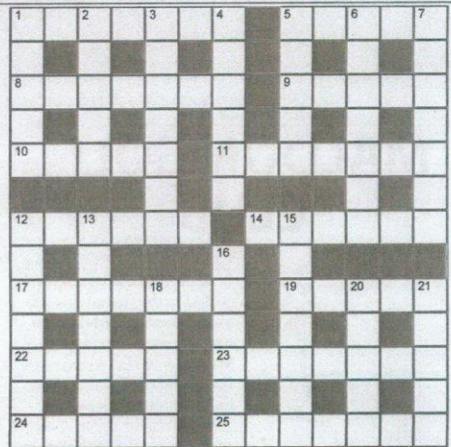
